1. SCOPE

Your privacy is important to Central Petroleum Limited (“the Company”). We take all reasonable steps to protect the personal information we hold from misuse, loss, unauthorised access, modification and disclosure. The Company is bound by the *Privacy Act 1988* (Cth) (“Privacy Act”), which sets out a number of principles concerning the privacy of individuals.

This document sets forth the personal information handling practices of the Company both generally and on its website, www.centralpetroleum.com.au.

Note, however, that the Company is located in Australia and data privacy laws may be less strict in Australia than those of the country in which you reside when you view this website.

For the purposes of this privacy policy, personal information is any information or opinion about an identified individual or an individual who is reasonably identifiable, regardless of whether the information or opinion is true or not. We may collect any of the following types of personal information about you: your name and contact details, information that could be used to identify you, photographs from which you are reasonably identifiable, and so forth.

2. HOW AND WHY WE COLLECT PERSONAL INFORMATION

We only collect the information we reasonably need for one or more particular function or activity we are carrying out and we only collect personal information by lawful and fair means, in accordance with the Privacy Act.

We collect personal information in a number of ways, as explained in further detail below. While we use reasonable efforts to collect personal information about you directly from you, we may also collect personal information about you from third parties.

We may collect personal information about you when you send an e-mail with a comment or question. We use this information to fulfill your request. When you provide any personal identifying information to us in this fashion, you communicate that you are knowingly and voluntarily providing us with the information.

Our website may from time to time use 'Cookies', pieces of information that a website can transfer to an individual's computer hard drive for record keeping. Cookies do not allow access to your hard drive but it assists in collecting information such as the server your computer is logged on to, your browser type and your IP address in order to provide you with a better online experience.

Where we receive personal information on an unsolicited basis, then (in accordance with our statutory obligations), we will promptly determine whether such personal information could lawfully have been collected had we requested the information or had otherwise actively sought the provision of such information.

The Company is not responsible for the data policies, procedures or content of other websites linked to ours. When you link to another site you have left our site and are therefore subject to the privacy policy of the new site.

We may collect, use, disclose and process personal information for a number of different purposes as set out in detail below.

We collect and store some information automatically regarding your visit to our website. As most websites do, we may gather information about you, including details of your operating system, data, time of visit, pages visited, documents downloaded, browser version, domain name and IP address as well as the details of the website you came from. This information is used to facilitate troubleshooting on our website and to further improve the website.

We collect your email and, if you provide it, other contact details when you subscribe to our mailing list on our website. We use this information for the purpose of sending you information about the Company. You may cancel any such request for mailings at any time by sending an e-mail request to info@centralpetroleum.com.au.

If you are or have been a security holder of the Company (such as a shareholder or option holder), Chapter 2C of the *Corporations Act 2001* (Cth) requires personal information about you as a security holder (including your name, address and details of the securities you hold) to be included in the public register of the Company. This personal information must continue to be included in the public register if you cease to be a security holder. The personal information contained in the Company's share register is also collected and used to facilitate payments and corporate communications (including financial results, annual reports and other information to be communicated to security holders).

Other purposes for which we collect and use personal information are:

- To operate our business;
- To communicate with you (including with respect to our website, such as to provide you with notices regarding changes to this privacy policy, and to develop, provide and improve our website;
- To provide products, services and information to you, to our service providers, to our customers and

to take steps in response to information requests or inquiries you may submit prior to entering into a contract with us or becoming an investor;

- To comply with our contractual obligations, to resolve disputes and to enforce our agreements with third parties;
- To share information with our related bodies corporate and other members of the group of companies that includes Central Petroleum Limited;
- For record keeping and administrative purposes, and to consider applications for employment with us;
- For compliance with ASX Listing Rules and obligations incidental to those imposed by the ASX Listing Rules;
- For fraud, loss, and other crime prevention purposes;
- For direct marketing purposes, including to enable us to send you marketing and promotional messages and other information that may be of interest to you, via email, SMS, social media or direct mail (subject to you not exercising your right to opt out of your receipt of such messages);
- To facilitate payments and corporate communications (including financial results, annual reports and other information to be communicated to security holders) to our shareholders;
- To assist in the investigation of suspected illegal or wrongful activity, and to protect and to defend our rights and property, or the rights or safety of third parties;
- To comply with laws, regulations, court orders and other legal obligations, or pursuant to legal processes, including compliance with Australian taxation laws and the *Corporations Act 2001* (Cth);
- Subject to applicable contractual or legal restrictions, in connection with contemplated reorganisation or an actual reorganisation of our business, in connection with financing, a sale or other transaction involving the disposal of all or part of our business or assets, including for the purpose of permitting due diligence required to decide whether to proceed with a transaction; and
- To maintain a safe working environment for our staff and contractors.

3. ANONYMITY AND PSEUDONYMITY

Where it is lawful and reasonable for you to do so, you have the right to deal with us on an anonymous or pseudonymous basis. As permitted by law, and subject to the following, we will give you the option of not identifying yourself, or of using a pseudonym, in dealing with us.

However, if you choose to interact with us in an anonymous or pseudonymous fashion, or you do not provide us with personal information on request, then we may be unable to provide you with the products or services you request.

Further, we reserve the right to verify your identity in certain circumstances. For example, we may need to verify your identity when you request that we provide certain products or services to you, in order to liaise with other service providers and in order to comply with its statutory and regulatory obligations.

We may create de-identified or anonymous data from personal information by removing data components (such as your name, email address, or linkable tracking ID) that makes the data personally identifiable to you or through obfuscation or through other means. Our use of de-identified or anonymised data is not subject to this privacy policy.

4. USE OF PERSONAL INFORMATION

We use personal information we collect for the fulfilment of one or more of the purposes outlined above, together with any other use as permitted, authorised or required by law.

Central Petroleum does not use computer programs to make decisions using personal information about you that could significantly affect your rights or interests.

5. DISCLOSURE OF PERSONAL INFORMATION

We may disclose personal information we collect to third parties but only on an as-needs basis and only to fulfil one or more of the purposes for which we collected the information, any secondary purpose related to the primary purpose(s) of collection, and otherwise as required or authorised by law.

Information and data you provide us may be disclosed to internal Company sites and to controlled entities of the Company.

We may disclose personal information to our service providers, customers, marketing providers, and vendors in order to maintain our website, and to provide, improve and personalise our products or services. We may also disclose personal information for other technical and processing functions, such as sending emails on our behalf, technical support, or otherwise operating our website, for analytics, and for marketing purposes. Such third parties may have access to personal information only as needed to perform their functions for us, and they may not use personal information for other purposes.

If ownership or control of all or part of our business changes, or we receive an offer or interest in making an offer to acquire us or any controlled entity or business operated by us, we may disclose your personal information to the interested party and/or to the new owner for the purpose of facilitating the negotiations regarding the offer and/or to facilitate the change in ownership or control.

We may disclose some or all of your personal information to persons to whom you authorise us to disclose your personal information.

If you are or have been a security holder of the Company (such as a shareholder or option holder), your personal information may be disclosed to or accessed by joint investors, the Company's registry Computershare Investor Services Pty Limited ("Computershare"), securities brokers, third party service providers, including print and mail service providers, technology providers and professional advisers, and each of their agents and contractors, and to the Australian Securities Exchange ("ASX") and other regulatory authorities, and in any case, where disclosure is required or allowed by law (which may include disclosures to the Australian Taxation Office and other government or regulatory bodies or where you have consented to the disclosure).

Generally, we do not disclose personal information to recipients located outside Australia. However, in some cases, the types of organisations referred to above to whom your personal information may be disclosed, may be located or may store data overseas. If we do so, then we will take reasonable steps to ensure that such service providers deal with the personal information to which they have access in a manner consistent with this privacy policy and in compliance with the requirements of the Privacy Act.

At this time, the Company's share registry service provider, Computershare, its related bodies corporate and service providers may view or access your personal information within those countries that Computershare operates its offices as listed at this URL: <https://www.computershare.com/corporate/about-us/locations/our-offices>.

We otherwise will not sell, rent, lease, trade or otherwise disclose the personal identifying information you provide to anyone outside of the Company. However, the Company reserves the right to use or disclose any information as needed to satisfy any law, regulation or legal request, to cooperate in any law enforcement investigation or to lessen a serious threat to a person's health or safety.

6. THIRD-PARTY-SITES

The Company is not responsible for the data policies, procedures or content of other websites linked to ours. When you link to another site you have left our site and are therefore subject to the privacy policy of the new site.

7. PROTECTION OF PERSONAL INFORMATION

We endeavour to take all reasonable steps to protect your personal data including use of encryption technology, but cannot guarantee the security of any data you disclose online. You accept the inherent security implications of dealing online over the Internet and will not hold the Company responsible for any breach of security unless we have breached our privacy obligations under the Privacy Act, been negligent or in wilful default of our obligation to take all reasonable steps to protect your personal data.

8. ACCESSING AND CORRECTING YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION

You may contact us to request access to or a correction of your personal information. While we will endeavour to give you full access or make corrections to your information promptly upon request, there may be legal or administrative reasons for us to deny these requests. Should this be the case we will provide you with the reason why your request was denied (if we can).
